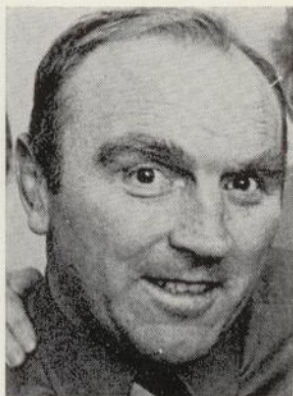

MR. RHYS WILLIAMS



Mr. Rhys Williams, the former Llanelli and Wales rugby player, has been the Assistant Education Officer with the Glamorgan Education Authority for the past six years.

Mr. Williams is a renowned sportsman and was a key member of the Llanelli Rugby Club for many years. He earned twenty-three International Caps for Wales as a second row forward between 1953 and 1960 and captained the Welsh team in 1960. He was selected for the British Lions and toured South Africa in 1955 and Australia and New Zealand in 1959.

His rugby prowess and his sportsmanship led to him being invited to play for the Barbarians and he represented them on their tours to Canada in 1957 and South Africa in 1958.

He was a member of the Llanelli team that played in Moscow in 1957. He retired from the game in 1960 but rugby followers still recall his many outstanding displays on the field of play.

Mr. Williams was educated at Ystalyfera Grammar School and Cardiff University. After serving in the R.A.F., he lectured at Gorseinon College of Further Education.

He then joined the Steel Company of Wales as a Departmental Manager, before returning to the education field in 1966.

He is married with one daughter and one son. He still takes an active interest in sport and has appeared on television in sports programmes.

A former pupil of Quakers Yard Grammar School, Brian joined the Company in September, 1967. He is at present receiving training in the Production Engineering Department, with the object of becoming a Junior Production Engineer, and has obtained his Mechanical Technicians Certificate Stage 4 at the Merthyr College of Further Education.

Brian was an active chairman of the Apprentice Association and was responsible for the major part of the planning for the Leap Frog event which raised £527.44. This was divided equally between The Kidney Research Unit for Wales Fund, and the Sunshine Home for Blind Children at Southerndown.

Works Manager's Shield Prizewinner

Alan joined the Company in September, 1966, from the Quakers Yard Grammar School and initially received training as a Toolmaker.

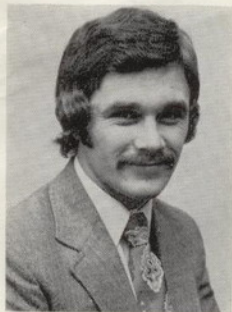
